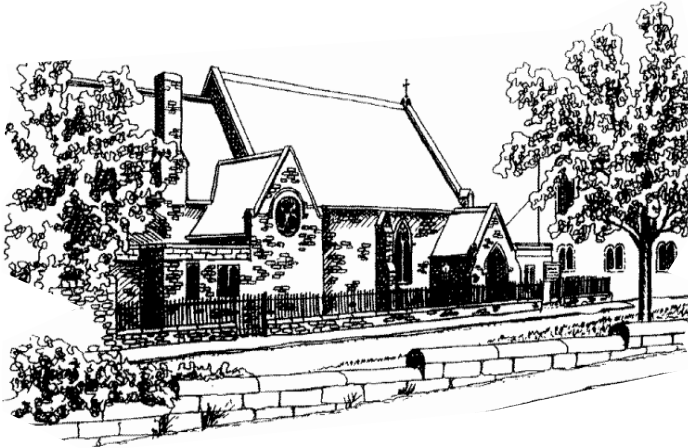

Pebbles on the Shore

Have you ever noticed that whichever supermarket checkout queue you choose to join; it's always the slowest! Even if you change queues halfway through queuing to one that seems to be moving faster you can be sure that something will go wrong before it's your turn!

A similar thing is true with traffic lights! Why is it that traffic lights always turn to red as you approach them? Why do they never turn to green? And I'm convinced, in Dunfermline that there must be more traffic lights per square mile than anywhere else in the Scotland - with the possible exception of Perth. I used to think Perth was the traffic light capital of the world, but having recently driven in the USA I have realised that Perth has nothing on some places there. At least in the UK we have roundabouts at lots of junctions. In the USA, you've guessed it . . . hardly any roundabout. Just traffic lights!

A friend of mine has worked out how long, in an average life, we spend doing things like waiting at traffic lights or in checkout queues - and it amounts to quite



a few days and even weeks and months! He also worked out that, on average when we get dressed, if we miss-button a shirt or trouser button and have to take 2 or 3 seconds to try again, at least once a day - then we waste getting on for a day of our lives doing this. Similarly, we waste about a week of our lives if we slip our shoes on and squash the heels under our feet and have to pull them back out again.

All very interesting, though I wonder how many hours or even days of his life my friend wasted making the above calculations!

However, though they might be trivial calculations, they do, I think, reflect something of our psyche! We hate to think that we're wasting time!

Our culture tells us that every second of every hour of every day has to be spent usefully. To be called a 'time-waster' is to be seriously insulted! And in the light

of this, our lives are lived at an increasingly frenetic pace! So many of us rush from one thing to another - with no time to think, and with no time for ourselves! Indeed, if we stop for a breath, or to relax, we feel guilty that we're not doing something useful! For many, the degree of busyness is a measure of status! Somehow, if we're so busy that we can hardly cope with all that we have to do, then we must be terribly important! And, of course, the Church provides no exception to this culture - neither for clergy or laity! Which is why, in the week before Holy Week, when I am frantically preparing for the 26 services we have planned, I am also writing this article!

But perhaps it could be different! Perhaps, in the midst of all our busyness and of our need to be 'doing' things all the time, we need to find time to be quiet and to relax and space to reflect on our lives and on the deeper questions that we sometimes think of, but rarely take time to consider! And perhaps, the Church has something to offer here!

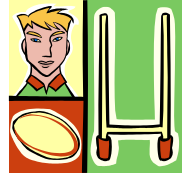

Children's World Day of Prayer

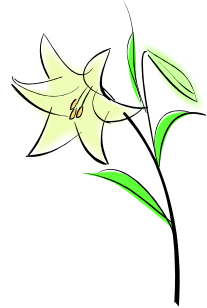

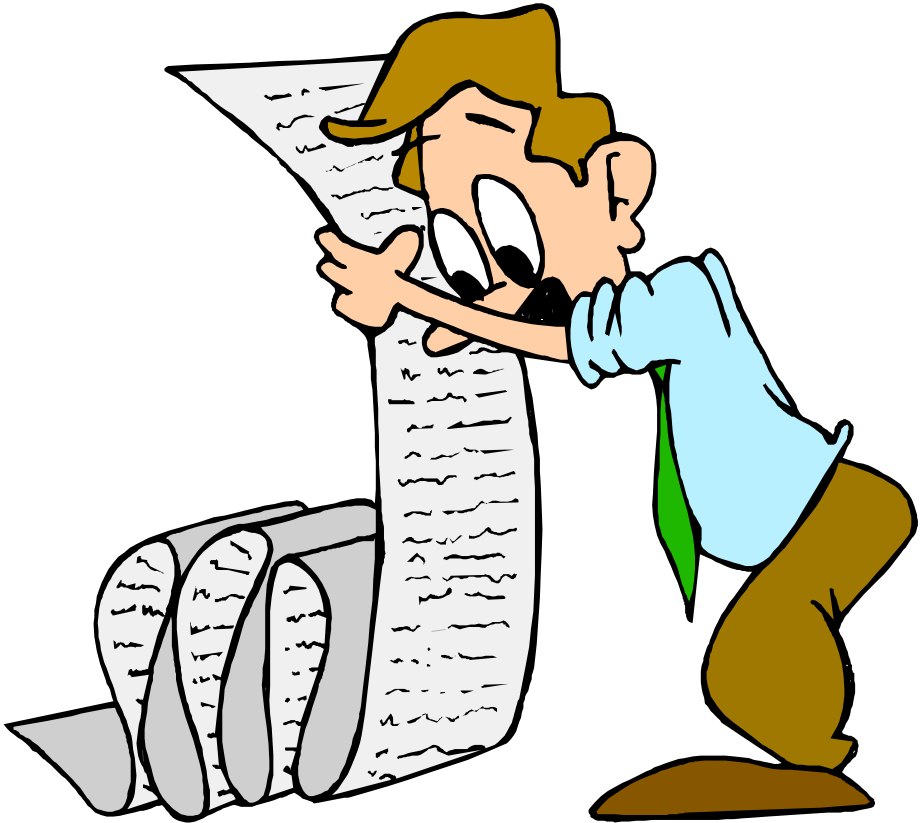
